## DRAFT ICA ALIGNS WITH ORIGINAL NEGOTIATION TERMS

The terms that would create the position for which Anaconda-Deer Lodge County representatives advocated during the Institutional Control Agreement (ICA) negotiations with Atlantic Richfield were publically discussed and approved on June 12th, 2012 during a County Commission meeting. The intent was to prepare County representatives so as to ensure the best possible outcome for the community by outlining clear goals and targets.

The primary goal of these terms was to protect

the health and safety of the people and environment of Anaconda-Deer Lodge County, through the funding of necessary superfund programs including the Institutional Controls program, Multipathway program, and Weed Management program. The impact of cumbersome permitting processes related to Superfund on business and industry development was recognized. As a result, this goal was further expanded to protect and support the economic assets of Anaconda-Deer Lodge County through the negotiation of an Old Works Golf Course trust account and a Developer Reimbursement trust account.

The majority of these goals and targets are reflected in the draft Institutional Controls Agreement, released to the public in August of this year, albeit the names of the trust accounts have evolved. Though it is not a component of the ICA, the Multipathway program was addressed in the 2013 amendment to the Community Soils Operable Unit Record of

Decision. This program more holistically addresses lead and arsenic in the community. For more information, contact the Community Protective Measures Program at (406) 563-7476.

The draft ICA was recently returned to Atlantic Richfield Company with the public's requested changes. The community will have the opportunity to review the revised Institutional Controls Agreement after its approval by Atlantic Richfield Company, EPA, and the State.
